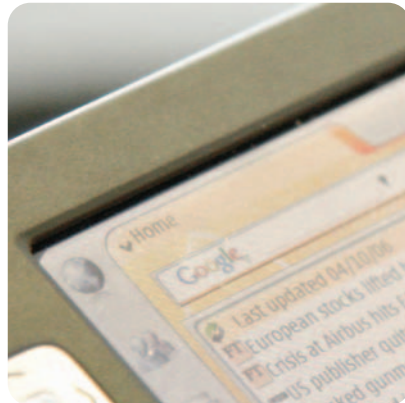

“Technology for Learning: Evidence & Evaluation” – hosted by Becta, lead by Vanessa Pittard, Director, Evidence & Evaluation, Becta – The Robert Perks Room (LEVEL ONE)

This seminar will explore the emerging findings from the evidence to date on the impact of technology on learning. Drawing on Becta’s Harnessing Technology research review, the seminar will provide an opportunity for delegates to explore what evidence is telling us about how current practice is transforming learning and opportunity. The session will also provide an opportunity to consider some of the emerging findings of the Becta commissioned evaluation of mobile learning.

“Universal Access: it's achievable, it's affordable, it's sustainable” – hosted by The e-Learning Foundation, lead by Valerie Thompson – The Oxford Room (LOWER GROUND)

Many schools see 1:1 access for school and home as an unaffordable yet desirable dream. Yet hundreds of schools are now doing just that, ensuring that every pupil in one or more year groups can participate equally in a sustainable way. And as VLEs become an established part of school life, then universal access will become increasingly vital.

Valerie Thompson and Ray Moore of the e-Learning Foundation will describe a number of simple measures that can be taken by schools to ensure equity of access to ICT when and where it is needed. Where additional funding such as Computers for Pupils or BSF is also available then the job becomes easier; but where that doesn't apply then the Digital Divide grants fund run by the Foundation has a role to play.

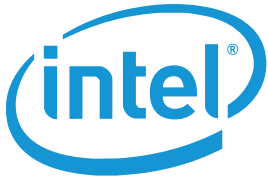

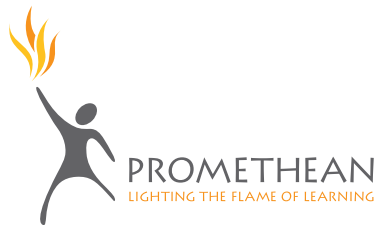
